

HUACA PUCLLANA. Site museum

The archaeological site of Huaca Pucllana owes its existence to the Lima Culture, developed in the valleys of the Chancay, Chillón, Rímac and Lurín rivers between 200 and 700 AD. approximately. However, Huaca Pucllana was built and used between 400 and 700 AD. The site is made up of a great Pyramid and low constructions around it, mostly made of adobes and filled with pebbles and sand. Originally the site had more than 16 hectares and was made up of several small pyramids around the one that can be seen today. Currently, there are six hectares left where the most important buildings were concentrated. In general, all of Pucllana is a ceremonial site, but we can say that the lower part has characteristics that make it have a more public character in contrast to the pyramid whose use seems to be more restricted. The lower part is called the "Northeast Complex". The site can be classified as a Temple and we suggest that it was dedicated to a female divinity associated with the sea and its resources. The site is currently in the middle of a residential and commercial area of Lima, this reality is recent and originally the surrounding land was for agricultural use (until the middle of the last century).
