

PACHACAMAC. Archeological Center
Daily departures, private service

Located at 31Km to the south of Lima by the South Pan-American Highway; this ancient pre-Columbian oracle rises. Built entirely with mud bricks (adobe), it was considered, along with Cusco, the main place of worship in pre-Hispanic Peru. Pilgrims came to this place from the most distant places to pay tribute to the God Pachacamac, (creator of the world and its creatures). The Inca part of the archaeological complex (1440 - 1533) is the best preserved. The archaeological site exhibits carefully restored palaces, squares and temples and has an on-site museum that houses an interesting collection of pieces found at the site.

Location: At Lurín district.

Visiting hours: Monday to Sunday (9:00 a 17:00)
